DoD	<p>By its charter, the SAPR IPT serves as the implementation and oversight arm of the Department's SAPR program. As described in the DoD Fiscal Year 2012 Annual Report on Sexual Assault in the Military, the SAPR IPT has also served as an information clearinghouse and a forum for the discussion of legislative requirements and the refinement of those requirements into DoD policies and programs.</p> <p>The DoD SAPRO Director provides a verbal summary of the key topics covered at each SAPR IPT to the Acting USD (P&R). Additionally, over the past year the Department has begun using the SAPR IPT as the mechanism for managing oversight and tracking progress on NDAA mandated SAPR provisions, Secretary of Defense-directed SAPR initiatives, tasks outlined in the 2013 SAPR Strategic Plan, and other significant developments in the SAPR operating environment. Progress on these items is discussed during the SAPR IPT and then shared with the USD (P&R) and Secretary of Defense during the DoD SAPRO Director's weekly meetings with those individuals.</p> <p>Thus, key discussion points, findings, and decisions from the SAPR IPT have been communicated and included in briefings provided to the Acting USD (P&R) and Secretary of Defense, but the SAPR IPT itself has not provided a direct briefing to those individuals.</p>
