NOTES:

1. Unable to calculate the average case load per agent due to limitations of how that information is captured in the current CGIS report writing system. The information would need to be hand-counted and the deadline to answer this tasker would not allow for this to be accomplished, in part, due to limited resources (personnel) in the CGIS Case Management Section.
2. "Total # Sex Asslt Cases" above equals ALL types of sexual assault and other sexual misconduct allegations, not just the adult crimes.
3. CGIS does not currently delineate in its case management system the difference between "attempted" crimes versus completed criminal acts. For this reason, as asked in question #133, the request to separate attempted penetrative sexual assaults from completed acts cannot be answered without reviewing each case file. The deadline to answer this tasker, coupled with the limited resources CGIS currently has in the Case Management Section does not allow for this question to be answered.
4. In 2011, CGIS created a new case category for those cases involving intimate partners, to include incidents involving "domestic violence". Whether a case was titled as a DV case has been dependent on the totality of the circumstances. If there were other offenses alleged, rape for example, the case may have been titled under "rape" versus "DV". As noted in the response to question #135, CGIS is in the process of implementing a new case management system that will better capture those offenses alleged, including the ability to run queries for the various offenses and/or alleged offenses that CGIS investigates.
5. While CGIS has sole responsibility for investigating unrestricted reports of sexual assault reported by or against CG members, CGIS also investigates a wide variety of other crimes, including complex crimes (environmental, fraud, death investigations, for example). As noted above, sexual assault, attempts of sexual assault, and other sexual misconduct encompassed approximately five (5) percent of all CGIS investigations from January 2011 to March 2014.
