

**LIEUTENANT COLONEL GEORGE CADWALADER, JR.**  
**UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS**

Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader earned his commission as a second lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps Reserve on 9 January 1993 after completing his undergraduate studies at the University of Wisconsin at Madison. He graduated, *cum laude*, from the University of Wisconsin Law School in May 1996.

In August 1996, Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader reported to The Basic School (TBS), Quantico, Virginia for duty as a student in Basic Officer Class 05-96. Upon graduation from TBS in March 1997, he reported to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, South Carolina for duty as a judge advocate at the Depot Law Center. Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader graduated with honors from Naval Justice School in July 1997.

While assigned to Parris Island, Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader served as a civil law officer, review officer, and as chief trial counsel. In addition, in 1998 he spent six months attached to the Recruit Training Regiment where he served as Follow Series Commander, Bravo Company, First Recruit Training Battalion.

In January 2000, Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader reported for duty as an instructor at Naval Justice School, Newport, Rhode Island. He served as an instructor in both the civil law and military justice departments. Additionally, he served as the Marine Representative at the Naval Justice School. During this assignment, he participated in training missions to the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Armenia, and Sierra Leone with the Defense Institute of International Legal Studies (DIILS).

Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader then became the Deputy Station Judge Advocate for Marine Corps Air Station Iwakuni, Japan from August 2003 through May 2006. He deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM in 2004 as a member of the Combined Joint Task Force -76 Office of the Staff Judge Advocate.

In May 2006, Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader transferred to 2d Marine Logistics Group, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina where he served as the 2d Legal Services Support Section Military Justice Officer. He then joined II Marine Expeditionary Force (Forward) in August 2008 as the Deputy Staff Judge Advocate, and deployed to the Al Anbar province of Iraq from January 2009 through January 2010 in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM. Upon his redeployment, Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader served as the Deputy Staff Judge Advocate for the 2d Marine Division before transferring to the United States Naval War College International Law Department in July 2010. During this assignment, he presented training on the law of armed conflict, rules of engagement, operational law and related topics to a variety of domestic and international audiences.

Lieutenant Colonel Cadwalader assumed his current position as Executive Officer, Naval Justice School in July 2012. He is married to the former Lisa Ann Sullivan. They have three children, John, Robert, and Courtney Elizabeth Cadwalader.
