

**Commander Kristie Robson**, Medical Corps, United States Navy, is a board-certified Emergency Medicine Physician and is currently assigned to the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED) as the Department Head of Clinical Programs. She was appointed as the BUMED Sexual Assault Medical Program Manager in August 2013. In this role she manages sexual assault forensic exam capabilities at 97 Military Treatment Facilities. Commander Robson earned her MD from Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia and earned her commission via the Armed Force Health Professions Scholarship Program. She completed a Surgical Internship and, subsequently, her Emergency Medicine Residency at Naval Medical Center San Diego.
