


Dear Ms. Adams:

(The court closed at 1334 hours, and following deliberations reopened at 1405.)

MJ: Ladies and Gentlemen, please be seated. The court will come to order. Let the record note all 10 court members are again present together with the trial counsel, assistant trial counsel<sup>both</sup>/defense counsel, the accused, court reporter and military judge. Sir, has the court reached a sentence in the case.

PRES: We have, sir.

MJ: Would you fold the sentence work sheet and CPT Earl will hand it to me to be examined prior to announcement in open court.

It appears to be in order, sir, and may be announced. Will the accused and counsel please rise.

#### SENTENCE

PRES: Private First Class Henry Gilmore, it is my duty as president of this court to inform you that the court in closed session and upon secret written ballot, three-fourths of the members present at the time the vote was taken concurring, sentences you to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined at hard labor for 20 years, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be dishonorably discharged from the service.


