

**General Ann E. Dunwoody
United States Army, Retired**



General Ann E. Dunwoody retired from the United States Army on August 15, 2012 after 37 years of service.

General Dunwoody's final tour of duty was as the Commanding General, U.S. Army Materiel Command (AMC). AMC is one of the largest commands in the Army with more than 69,000 employees and impacts or has a presence in all 50 states and in 145 countries. She is the first woman in U.S. military and uniformed service history to achieve four-star officer rank.

General Dunwoody received a direct commission as a Quartermaster officer in 1975, after graduating from the State University of New York at Cortland. In 1988, she earned a Master of Science Degree in Logistics Management from the Florida Institute of Technology. She earned a Master of Science Degree in National Resource Strategy from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces in 1995.

In her career, General Dunwoody commanded at every level, including the company, battalion, division, brigade and major installation levels.

She has been recognized as a 2001 Distinguished Alumni for the State University of New York at Cortland, the 2004 recipient of the National Defense Transportation Association's DoD Distinguished Service Award, the 2007 recipient of the Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW) Distinguished Service Award, the 2009 recipient of the Association of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces Eisenhower Award, the 2011 recipient of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Theodore Roosevelt Award, and a 2011 recipient of the French National Order of Merit.

She is currently the president of First 2 Four, LLC, a leadership mentoring and strategic advisory services company. She also serves on the board of directors of L-3 Communications, Republic Services, and the Logistics Management Institute. She was recently elected to the United States Army's Council of Trustees.
