US Army, (Retired)



Commissioned through the Army ROTC program, Jim Campbell graduated in 1971 from the University of Missouri with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education. He also holds a Master of Science from the University of Illinois, also in Physical Education, and a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the US Naval War College.

He served over 36 years in the Army, leading Soldiers in war and peace. He commanded the United Nations Quick Reaction Force in Somalia; led a multi-national staff in Haiti; served as the commander of Joint Task Force Full Accounting, with the mission to account for those missing from the Vietnam conflict; commanded, as the commanding general of the 10th Mountain Division, a multi-national division in Bosnia to enforce the Dayton Peace Accords, and served as the commanding general of all Army forces in the Pacific. In his final assignment, he served as the Director of the Army Staff in the Pentagon, responsible for coordinating and synchronizing the day-to-day efforts of a million-person Army.

He currently serves as a senior advisor to the Chief of Staff, Army and assists in the development of the Army's General officers.

He has a passion for baseball, and pulls for the Atlanta Braves. He and his wife Carol live in Alexandria, Virginia with their Golden Retriever, Glory. The most significant award he received as a Soldier was the opportunity to serve his country.
