

Ms. Carol L. Haig (Colonel, Retired, U.S. Army Reserve) currently serves as Chief, Women's Health Service Line and the Deputy, Sexual Harassment/Assault Response and Prevention Workgroup, Office of the U.S. Army Surgeon General. Her previous military positions include Staff Officer, Office of the Surgeon General, Falls Church, Virginia, from 2010 to 2011; I Corps Surgeon (Rear), Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, from 2009 to 2010; Assistant Chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Chief Midwifery Service, Officer in Charge Women's Health Clinic, Fort Hood, Texas, from 2003 to 2005. In her civilian career, Ms. Haig served in numerous positions as a Women's Health Nurse Practitioner (WHNP), Certified Nurse Midwife, and a Sexual Assault Clinical Provider (SACP) at a variety of Department of Defense facilities and civilian practices.
