

Basic Law Enforcement



- MOS 5811 – Basic Military Police School
 - U.S. Army Military Police School
 - 2 Hours of training received
 - Focus areas - Conduct Preliminary Investigation, Conduct Interviews, Protect Crime Scene, Interpersonal Comm Skills, Military Law
- Annual training requirements
 - NCIS provided 1st Responder Training as directed in the CMC 2012 Campaign Plan “NLT 1 November 2012, coordinate with the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) for additional training of Provost Marshal’s Offices and Marine Corps Police Departments to enhance capabilities and reinforce first responder responsibilities for cases involving sexual assault.”
- Marine Corps Civilian Law Enforcement Program – Basic Police Office Course
 - Marine Corps Law Enforcement Academy
 - 2.5 hours of “Sexual Offenses and Response Training”
 - Focus areas (1) Identify Types of Sexual Assault
(2) Recognize Response Protocols for Sexual Crimes
- Annual training requirements
 - NCIS provided 1st Responder Training as directed in the CMC 2012 Campaign Plan



CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS



- USMC CID
 - Attends USAMPS Criminal Investigation Division Special Agent Course (CIDSAC).
 - An MCIO level course
 - Train side by side with Army CID
 - Additional training is the USAMP Special Victims Unit SVU
 - Annual training
 - Numerous hours of investigative training is received by every investigator. All topics cover sexual assault investigations as part of the training. (Examples of training include scene response, interviews/interrogations, crime scene processing, crime and jurisdictional identification and managing investigations)
